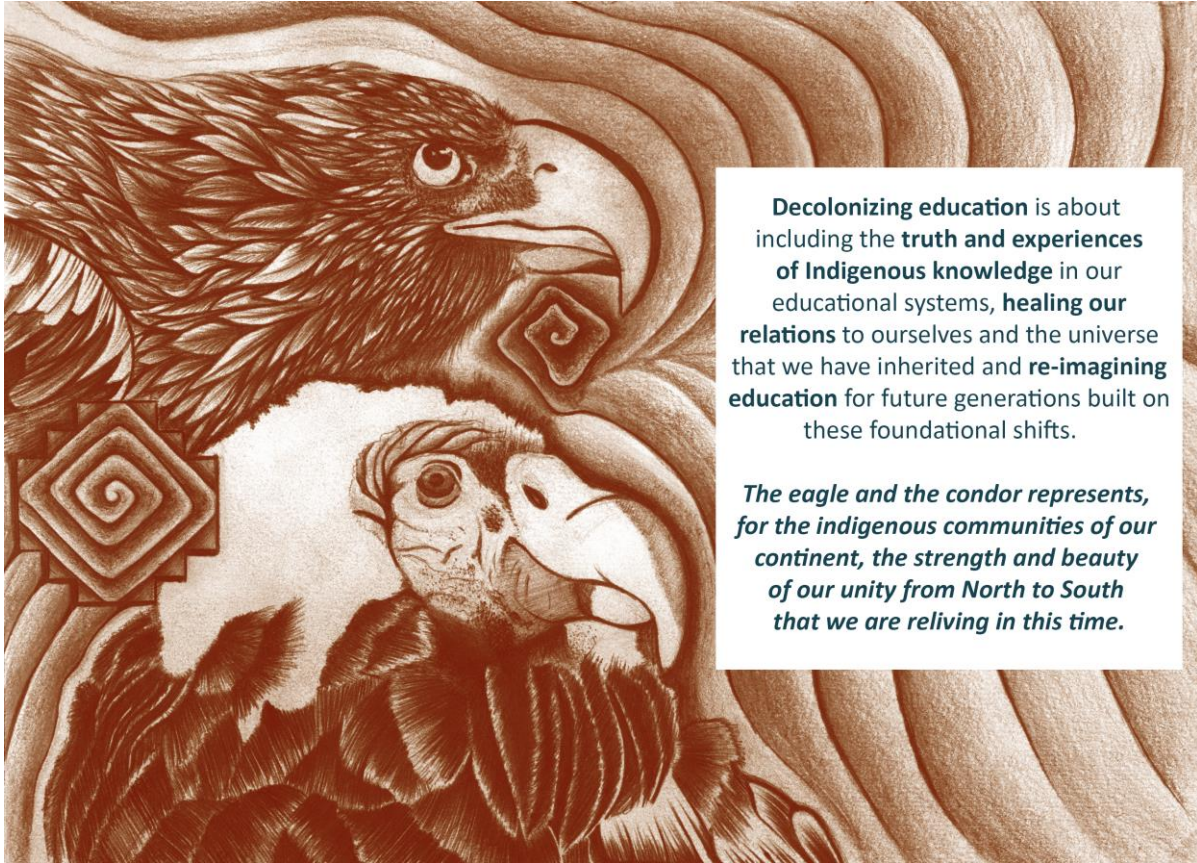


A CALL FOR DECOLONIZING EDUCATION
